




Maintenance Updates

- Railing installation ongoing
- Houston CDS work almost complete, groundwater treatment system demobilized

Phase 1.3 and Phase 2 Construction

- Ph. 1.3: Graham to Cesar Chavez
 - Removal of treatment system allows work to start on the bioretention pond on the new federal courthouse property
 - Installing Nueva crest gate hydraulic lines
 - Nueva Street water line work starting in the next couple of weeks





Phase 1.3 and Phase 2 Construction

- Ph. 2: Guadalupe to RR Bridge
 - Camp transmission tower has been relocated
 - Completed additional field work for Feature 67, submitting report to agencies for review
 - Alamo traffic switch expected early next week, will maintain pedestrian access across Alamo




Phase 3 and 4 Design

Stop 1: Aquatic Plants



The native plants in the creek provide natural benefits to the aquatic system. These purposefully chosen species shade water surface, help to filter out contaminants, serve as a habitat for aquatic organisms, and overall improve the water quality.
