

Project Goal



- The San Antonio River Authority (SARA) Board has approved a project to initiate the creation of conceptual design for the Alazan, Apache, Martinez, and San Pedro Creeks anticipated to include ecosystem restoration and recreational features while preserving the stormwater protection the channels provide.
- SARA is hopeful that a conceptual design phase will generate interest in the community pursuing an ecosystem restoration project, similar to the Mission Reach of the San Antonio River Improvements Project.

Project Background



- Persistent flooding concerns in these neighborhoods resulted in 1954 Federal Authorization of the San Antonio Channel Improvements Project (SACIP).
- Design and construction of the channelized creeks occurred in the 1960's and 1970's with the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), and SARA as the Local Sponsor.
- Although the flood protection was welcomed, the natural environment has been degraded and little of the natural elements of the creeks remain.
- The creekways alignment was straightened and cross-sections were made substantially deeper and wider with 3:1 slope side slopes.
- Existing trees and understory were removed. The channel was re-vegetated with Coastal bermuda grass and maintenance requires the channel to be kept clear of trees.

- Aug. 2010 Draft Conceptual Design Report presented
- April 2011 Presentation of Draft Final Report
- July 2011 Westside Creeks chosen for US Army Corps of Engineers National Pilot Study
- Dec. 2011 San Pedro Creek



 An Interlocal Agreement was executed on June 26th, 2012 between the City of San Antonio and the San Antonio River Authority for project management of 2010 Sales Tax Venue – Greenway Project for hike and bike trail improvements in association with the Westside Creeks Restoration Project, as well as the 2012 Bond Project and 2012 Stormwater Regional Facilities Project for park and stormwater improvements in the Elmendorf Lake Park area, for a total contract cost not to exceed \$15,116,980.00

- \$2,000,000 in Linear Creekway Funds COSA 2010 Sales Tax Proposition
- \$7,000,000 in Bexar County Flood Control Funds
- \$14,250,000 in Total funding for Elmendorf Lake Park¹



Once the report is released by OMB the project will be eligible for the US Army Corps of Engineers to begin funding the Preliminary Engineering Design (PED).


















Westside Creeks Ecosystem Restoration Update

- Dec. 2016 OMB informed the Corps of Engineers that it "does not object" to the Corps submitting the WSC report to Congress for funding consideration.
- Jan. 2017 Assistant Secretary of the Army, Jo-Ellen Darcy, reports that the Westside Creeks will be evaluated amongst other ecosystem restoration projects and prioritized as appropriate for budgetary considerations.
- Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 Corps of Engineers Work Plan allocates final Mission Reach reimbursement payment of \$26,031,000.
- FY 21 Corps of Engineers Work Plan published 2 days before inauguration.
- FY 22 Community Project Funding (earmark) community support letters from Judge, Mayor, Chamber of Commerce and WSC Oversight Committee Co-Chairs




Phase 1.2 Updates

- Still waiting on USACE design recommendation for archaeological site





Phase 1.3 and Phase 2 Construction


- Nueva underground electric and gas work wrapping up; water line expected to start in two weeks






