



Call Summary: The San Antonio River Authority, in partnership with Bexar County, seeks to commission a large-scale, functional artwork for Phase 3 of San Pedro Creek Culture Park which is currently under construction. The artwork must provide (and demonstrate) water quality improvements, one of the main goals of Culture Park, by capturing, diverting and treating run off from the Interstate 35 bridge overpass. The artwork will be located near the confluence of San Pedro and Apache Creeks, where the Culture Park meets an existing trail leading to the San Antonio River.



PHASE 3

Budget: \$250,000

Deadline: 5:00 PM CT, March 30, 2022

Eligibility: United States



Call Summary: The San Antonio River Authority, in partnership with Bexar County, seeks to commission an artist to create a **3-dimensional** artwork for Phase 4 of San Pedro Creek Culture Park. The artwork will **serve as a beacon** for the El Paso Street Trailhead (where El Paso Street crossed the creek) and celebrate the unique history of the Culture Park. The artwork should be visible from street while also being accessible to pedestrian traffic and may be located near the trailhead or parking lot entrance.



PHASE 4

Budget: \$50,000

Deadline: 5:00 PM CT, March 30, 2022

Eligibility: Bexar County



Call Summary: The San Antonio River Authority, in partnership with Bexar County, seeks to commission artists and writers to create custom tile patterns, graphics for decorative metal screens, and poetry for Phase 2, 3, and 4 of San Pedro Creek Culture Park. The custom tile designs will be translated into hand-made ceramic tiles that will be located on benches throughout the three phases. The decorative metal screens will be placed in the landscaping along the creek between El Paso and Guadalupe Streets and will provide privacy from the adjacent parking lot. The poetry will be etched into limestone blocks that are used to form retaining walls.








